

Where should we go from here and what direction should Prescott Indivisible take?

Reach out to young people

More educational methods – handouts, etc., issue based

More training on how to respond to controversy/educate on issues

Indivisible website says “oppose Trump’s agenda” – change so group is more inclusive, issue based, non-partisan

Broaden base – review Indivisible site and get off of Trump Agenda / move to specific issues

Inclusive / reaching out to Trump people

Emphasize Indivisible in the Pledge of Allegiance

Bumper stickers, magnets, window clings

Pay attention to education

Involve ourselves in State issues

Keep doing what we have been and fine-tune it

Train ourselves to be effective communicators

Reflect individual passions of the whole group so that the diversity of the group is reflected

Yes to involvement in local politics

Voter registration / facilitate voter registration – members and others; all members of Indivisible

Host candidates / debates – both sides

Sign up / commit to Council meetings, etc., - get Council Agendas

League of Women Voters – powerful affiliate to explain – learn from them – contact

Endorse issues thereby supporting / endorsing candidate – Sierra Club process.

We need to be part of local candidates

Expand our contacts into county politics – Dewey, Prescott Valley, etc.

Encourage people to vote, sign-up for mail-in ballots, **register to vote**

Booths at events with PI to publicize our group

Have **events to register people to vote**, immigrant rights, recruit people (wine festivals, music events, parades, rodeos, Farmer’s markets, etc.)

Continue our marches, take out ads in papers to publicize PI, issues

Have candidates speak to PI group to present their positions

Indivisible groups from State should come together as a group

Developing individuals to run for offices

We need position statements – go on the offense – present positive positions

Committees / come up with position teams

Redistricting maps – get involved.

Evaluate a candidate on specific issues by questionnaire and use responses to educate membership as well as public (potential endorsement)

Work for candidates personally – not as a group (PI) but individually

Not to prohibit members to work together for candidate

If candidate requests face time to address membership – accommodate it

Not enough #s for Tuesday march in separate locations – consolidate to one location – issue based

Communicate – not every week?
